

COURAGE

HEROES AMONG US

The Star and Crescent of Kappa Sigma Fraternity has long been a blueprint for how members of Kappa Sigma Fraternity should live their life. The Star and Crescent contains the values that Brothers of Kappa Sigma Fraternity are expected to follow as they carry out the day-to-day activities that make Kappa Sigma Brothers stand out among their peers and as pillars of strength for our society. The third value in the Star and Crescent is “courage.”



Certainly courage can be demonstrated in many different ways, but this particular value has never been more on display in the recent history of our Fraternity than it is today as Brothers across North America face the COVID-19 virus. There are many Brothers who have stepped forward to serve our society on the frontlines from proving medical care to COVID-19 victims, serving as first responders and emergency medical personnel, and organizing significant support to our communities.

The heroes who display this courage every day are as varied and diverse as Kappa Sigma, but like all Kappa Sigmas, they share a commitment to serve others and reflect the values of our Fraternity. Here are just a few.



Lieutenant Colonel Brian Freidline is a 1995 initiate of the Theta-Zeta Chapter at Eastern New Mexico University. Brother Freidline is currently a Hospital Commander for the United States Army, and was sent to New York to lead his unit at the Javits Center. Brother Freidline was recently

decorated for his service and leadership in the Task Force Northeast for the 44th Medical Brigade. That Task Force included Marines, Soldiers, Airmen, Sailors, and Coast Guardsmen.

In a letter from Major General E. M. Neary, U.S. Marine Corp, Brother Freidline and his brigade were decorated with the following commendation in a letter of appreciation. The letter stated "we made history not because we fought the COVID-19, but because we came together for our nation to take care of our people. We treated every human life as the most important – as if they were a brother or sister, we possessed the skills, commitment to excellence and respect for human decency to do our job despite the fact that the enemy we were fighting had no face. Relying on our training, sense of duty and trust in one another, we helped our nation counterattack this pandemic." The Joint Task Force was further commended for their attention to detail displayed in the selflessness and the consistent teamwork employed to stop COVID-19 and provide a sense of relief to fellow American citizens.



Brother Luke Huckaba is a 2015 initiate of the Lambda-Omicron Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity at the University of North Alabama. He is a Registered Nurse at Huntsville Hospital in Huntsville, Alabama. He works in the Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit. He is a graduate of the Nursing Program at the University

of North Alabama, and was inducted into the Nursing Honorary Society Sigma Theta Tau. He is a past recruitment chair for Lambda-Omicron Chapter.

Brother Huckaba recently spent 21-days in a row at Kings County Hospital Center in New York working 12-hour shifts. Brother Huckaba is a native of Russellville, Alabama, and received shout outs from his Brothers of Lambda-Omicron Chapter for his heroic efforts in fighting COVID-19 in one of the most significant hotspots for the virus.



Brother Luke Hardcastle is a 2006 initiate of the Omicron-Epsilon Chapter at Adelphi University in Garden City, New York. Brother Hardcastle served as Grand Master of Ceremonies for the Omicron-Epsilon Chapter during his undergraduate years and is a Master of the Ritual. He has also served in multiple volunteer alumni positions for Kappa Sigma Fraternity and is currently the Alumnus Advisor for the Omicron-Epsilon Chapter. Brother Hardcastle is one of many initiates of the Omicron-Epsilon Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity who are serving on the frontlines as policemen, firemen, nurses, and who are involved in heroic efforts to provide service to the New York community on so many fronts. Brother Hardcastle is a New York Fire Department Paramedic assigned to Station 4. He is certified as a Rescue Paramedic and has received training in Hazmat and Technical Rescue at the Fire Department's Technical Rescue School. Section 4 is located in Downtown Manhattan.

Recently Luke and his fellow rescue workers received an outpouring of support from friends, family, and complete strangers. They were greeted with cheers, applause, and encouragement by fellow New Yorkers who clapped, banged pots and pans out windows, and extended simple gestures of support for their efforts. This display from the community spoke volumes to those who place themselves in danger each and every day for the benefit of their fellowman.



Brother James R. Burns is a 2009 initiate of the Epsilon-Mu Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity at the University of Tulsa. Brother Burns received a Bachelor of Science and Nursing Degree from the University of Tulsa in 2013. He has his PCCN Certification and is currently enrolled in Nurse Practitioner

School. He currently serves as a registered nurse on a COVID Unit at St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Brother Burns stated "on a normal day I am an RN on a respiratory care unit. On March 22nd we converted to the first COVID Unit at St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma. There have been many tough days, but I know we will get through this together."



Brother Jonathan Nalli is a 1994 initiate of the Beta-Nu Chapter at the University of Kentucky, and currently serves as Senior Vice President of Ascension and Ministry Market Executive of Ascension St. Vincent in Indiana. Founded by the Daughters of Charity in 1881, Ascension St. Vincent has 20 hospital locations, and is composed of quaternary

and tertiary facilities, critical access hospitals, specialty centers, and multi-specialty physician group. Ascension is the nation's largest Catholic and nonprofit health system and a leader in medical excellence.

While serving during the COVID-19 pandemic, Nalli has never lost sight of his organization's Mission: To care for all persons with special attention to those who are poor and vulnerable. Brother Nalli said "During all times, but especially during a global crisis, it is my responsibility to ensure our Mission drives everything we do. From financial decisions to statewide operational plans, I work with our leadership teams and associates to remain focused on the task at hand, which is to provide spiritually-centered, holistic care." Nalli says that he witnessed remarkable selflessness and sacrifice among associates—a testament to every member of his team's commitment to exceptional care and industry leading safety standards.

One of the key factors enabling the hospital to provide such care is the strength of the hospital staff and associates. "Through our tight integration with Ascension, we have been able to offer the most comprehensive associate well-being and financial stability programs in the healthcare industry." Nalli said it is not only the financial stability and good sleep that makes his associates whole. "One of the concerns I never wanted our staff to think about was whether or not they would have adequate levels of PPE." Due to a fully coordinated national approach to resources and supplies, as well as conservation efforts led by Nalli's leadership team, he proudly shared that none of the Ascension St. Vincent facilities have incurred critical shortages of PPE or supplies.

Brother Nalli was named to the Times of Northwest Indiana "20 Under 40" list in 2008, and honored as an "Up & Comer" in 2018 by Modern Healthcare, the leader in healthcare business news, research and data. Brother Nalli stated "Ascension St. Vincent is leading the way, fully re-opening all facilities. Offering non-urgent and elective procedures, surgeries, and diagnostics during a pandemic requires a firm commitment to the safety and disinfection measures hospitals have always been known for while adding even more layers of protection for patients and care teams. Our hospitals are safe and clean. They always have been. And, now, we are doubling down on that, because we want community members to feel confident when they walk through our doors, whether it be in the ER, a primary care clinic, or surgery center."



Brother Blair Holladay is a 1981 initiate of the Kappa-Chi Chapter at the College of Charleston. Brother Holladay is Chief Executive Officer of the American Society for Clinical Pathology, the largest organization for pathology and laboratory medicine in the world. ASCP's mission is to provide education, certification, and advocacy on behalf of patients,

pathologists, and laboratory professionals worldwide. Dr. Holladay's scientific research work focuses in the areas of Cyto Pathology and Molecular Research, for which he has been funded as a principle investigator for 95 scientific research grants and 100 scientific corporate contracts. Dr. Holladay has also published a number of significant research articles within the profession, is an active scientific lecturer and has given over 200 national and international speeches.

Brother Holladay was recently featured in the College of Charleston Today for his fight against COVID-19. Brother Holladay stated, "what we have been doing is trying to increase the ability for your prototypical laboratory to spool up to do five to ten times the number of tests that they can actually run on a given day using the same number of medical laboratory personnel." He further stated "you can't just recruit people off the street, because it is a very complex molecular text.

Brother Holladay was an undergraduate member of the Kappa-Chi Chapter in the fall of 1981 when he developed a relationship with an Italian student named Augusto Pellegrini, also a Kappa Sigma. When Northern Italy was impacted by COVID-19 in March of 2020, Pellegrini reached out to Brother Holladay who helped obtain personal protection equipment and ventilators desperately needed in the Lombardy region of Italy.

"He immediately went to work with his staff in Chicago, and in a few days, they were able to send us 58 lifesaving machines," says Brother Pellegrini. "The hospital, the doctors and I were immensely moved by this gesture. We were feeling outright alone in the face of this invisible monster. Our government did not send us anything; the doctors and nurses did not have surgical masks; our European partners had blocked the borders and did not send any relief, and here comes ASCP that donated the lifesaving ventilators, which helped saved more than 100 lives." In turn, the Italians shared a lot of their experiences and data. "Two Fraternity Brothers created an international opportunity to help save lives in both of their countries," says Holladay. "You take an oath with your Fraternity Brother to always support each other, and that commitment allowed us to help both of our countries."

In the midst of these incredible challenges, Brothers of Kappa Sigma Fraternity have not forgotten the lesson of service to their fellowman and are standing strong with great "courage. ★

Kappa Sigma Brothers Serving on the Front Lines of the COVID-19 Pandemic



George Bohannon ('67) (B.A. Physics & Mathematics '69) epitomizes the benefits of Oklahoma City University's interdisciplinary, applied curriculum, particularly what is now universally labeled as STEM for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. He has contributed greatly to physics-related fields for more than 40 years.

He always loved science. In elementary school in Cushing, Oklahoma, the local library had a reading program in which children were recognized for each book they read. Bohannon read more than 100 books, and most of them were about science.

At OCU, Bohannon recalls doing well in his beginning physics class, and "maybe it was going to my head, so I had to be put in my place!" Professor Thomas Boster sent him to the blackboard to work out a physics problem that Bohannon had not seen before. "There I was standing alone in front of the class, and I bombed horribly. After that, I was a lot more humble in that class."

For his differential equations class with Dr. Reino Hakala, Bohannon stayed up all night to solve a difficult problem, taking his elaborate answer to Dr. Hakala the next morning, immediately returning to his dorm room, and sleeping through class time. "I came to realize much later that a more evenly measured approach to work is a more effective approach to life in general."

Bohannon was among the students who started OCU's chapter of Kappa Sigma in 1967. "We prided ourselves in having the highest average GPA of all fraternity colonies and chapters on campus."

Between his last two years at OCU, Bohannon received a National Science Foundation summer fellowship at the University of North Texas, working on "numerical calculations related to a quantum statistical theory of nuclei." He also had his first experience with digital computers and writing computer programs.

After graduating from OCU, he received a research assistantship at Michigan State University, earning master's and doctoral degrees in Physics in 1974. His Ph.D. thesis was a detailed examination and calculation of contributions to the nuclear force.

After graduating from MSU, he accepted a two-year post-doctoral position in the nuclear physics branch of Los

Alamos National Laboratory followed by a post-doctoral position at Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Thereafter, he returned to Los Alamos to work for three years. He interviewed for several positions, including the Nevada Test Site near Las Vegas, where underground nuclear testing was conducted. East underground test location included a large tower containing above-ground components of the test equipment. The test manager challenged Bohannon to climb to the top of a tower. Although uncomfortable with heights, Bohannon accepted the challenge, climbed to the top, and was subsequently offered a job, which he declined. A few days later, he read that an underground test had breached the surface and spewed radioactive dust into the air. He was relieved that he wasn't working there.

In 1982, Bohannon joined engineering firm XonTech, Inc., developing software for evaluating missile defense radar systems for the Air Force. He also worked with NASA's Orbital Debris Characterization project. NASA was concerned about the growing amount of "space junk," such as remnants of final stage rocket bodies that had carried satellites into orbit. Occasionally the remaining fuel in a rocket body would explode, scattering thousands of fragments into orbit—a serious threat to active military and commercial satellites, as well as to the Space Shuttle and the impending International Space Station.

The U.S. Space Surveillance Network kept track of pieces larger than 10 centimeters in diameter. But smaller pieces were also threatening because of their high orbital speeds and difficulty to detect. XonTech sought methods to determine the numbers and sizes of smaller pieces versus orbital parameters. Bohannon's job was to develop an algorithm for estimating debris sizes.

In the Kwajalein Atoll in the western Pacific, technicians obtained real-life debris radar data by dropping debris pieces from high-altitude balloons and tracking those pieces with radar as they tumbled back to Earth. Bohannon observed several of these drops from a helicopter. "Sitting in the Huey with the side doors wide open at about 3,000 feet altitude was an interesting experience," he says.

In 2006 he joined Technology Service Corporation, another LA engineering company, where he still works, focused on radar system modeling and radar algorithm design. He and his wife, Karina, have four children: Esmeralda, Cheryl Yovany, and Alan.

Reflecting, Bohannon says, "I've often thought I would like to create a list of people who were most influential in my life. Dr. Boster and Dr. Hakala would certainly be on that list. The fact that two of the people on my list were at OCU says a lot for the school."




The Flyover Nation: Energy's Role in a Troubled Heartland


evolving global marketplace, will the Heartland become America's "great connector" or "great divide?"



More than ten years after the murder of Meredith Emerson, lead investigator John Cagle (Lambda-Xi, Georgia College and State University, '74) reveals his take on the case and the lasting impact it has had on his life in his transparent true crime debut, *Those Days in January: The*

Abduction and Murder of Meredith Hope Emerson.

Twenty-four-year-old Meredith Emerson was abducted by sixty-one-year-old Gary Michael Hilton while hiking at Blood Mountain with her dog on New Year's Day in 2008. Hilton held her captive for three days before killing her. He was found not long after, pleaded guilty in trial, and was sent to death row in Florida. The Meredith Emerson case is one that will go down in Georgia history as a gruesome and cautionary tale for all those who enjoy the outdoors.

"Meredith Emerson seemed to be the All-American girl with a wonderful family and group of friends who loved and supported her," says Cagle. "For her life to end this way at the hands of such an evil person was such a tragedy."


In *Those Days in January*, Cagle, the lead investigator for the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, takes readers through the investigation from start to finish in a day-by-day account. Readers witness firsthand the struggle to seek justice for Meredith, all while law enforcement does their best to protect her memory from the opportunists, sensationalist reporters, and unscrupulous practices that threatened to deny her the dignity she deserves. Chapter by chapter, Cagle reveals not only the facts of her murder, but the impact on the personal lives of those who worked tirelessly to find Meredith.

Cagle wrote *Those Days in January* to give those interested in the case a more intimate look into what happened in the investigation than what TV stations could provide. He also hopes it

can be therapeutic for himself and others who were close to the case. "For years I have struggled with this case, as some other agents have," says Cagle. "I broke a rule that every investigator must follow. I let this case become personal. I simply got too close to it. I'm hopeful telling this story will help me move on."

Brother Cagle is now an adjunct professor in the Department of Criminal Justice at the University of North Georgia and teaches courses in criminal investigations.

He would go on to attend college and earn a bachelor's and master's degree. The Hartsell family is a very close and loving family, and like any American family with a special needs member, it causes significant stressors. Evin challenges the reader to reach deep into your soul and uncover the inner barriers that may be holding you back. Evin very candidly shares his personal insights on family interactions, his thoughts, fears, and daily activities. Come inside and take a glimpse at Evin's life in his *Abled in a Disabled World*.

Delta-Psi (Michigan State University)





Rho-Omega (Stevens Institute of Technology)




Xi-Iota (Columbus State University)



Chi (Purdue University)



Former Purdue University President Dr. Steven C. Beering, who expanded and diversified the West Lafayette campus during his 18-year tenure, passed away on April 7, 2020. He was 87.

Brother Beering was born Aug. 20, 1932, in Berlin and spent most of his early years in Hamburg, where his father managed two retail furniture stores before World War II. After the war, the family moved to London and then to the U.S. in 1948, settling near Pittsburgh. He eventually earned a degree from the University of Pittsburgh.

Before that, he served 12 years in the Air Force, during which time he became an adviser to the U.S. surgeon general in internal medicine and a medical consultant to NASA, where he was a physician to the nation's first astronauts and to President Dwight Eisenhower.

Beering went to Purdue in 1983 after serving as Dean of the Indiana University School of Medicine and Director of the IU Medical Center in Indianapolis.

Brother Beering was initiated into the Chi Chapter at Purdue University on March 23, 1985.

"His 18-year leadership of our institution was but one chapter in an epic life of serial achievement," current President of Purdue University Mitch Daniels said.

Under Brother Beering, Purdue expanded its international efforts, grew its liberal arts programs, promoted diversity and added 20 major buildings. Enrollment of international students grew threefold to become the largest at any public university.

His 17-year tenure as president wasn't the longest "But in 17 years," Tim McGinley Purdue University Trustee said, "it's safe to say there wasn't a part of campus that Steve Beering didn't know and didn't touch."

Beering requested that both he and his wife be buried at Purdue. They are buried on the Purdue campus in what is known as David Ross Memorial Acres.

Former chairman to the William and Mary Real Estate Foundation Board, and two-term vice chairman to William and Mary's Board of Visitors, John W. Gerdelman ('72), joined Chapter Celestial on January 4, 2020.

Brother Gerdelman, 67, was diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) the preceding February and in April 2019 was put into hospice care until his death on Jan. 4. After World War II, Brother Searfoss attended Bowling Green State University, where he was a Founding Father of the Epsilon-Eta Chapter in 1947. He would later have the pleasure of seeing his younger brother, Kenneth Searfoss, initiate into Kappa Sigma at the Epsilon-Eta Chapter in 1955. Brother Searfoss also attended Epsilon-Eta's 2017 rechartering, making him the only Kappa Sigma Brother in attendance at both Chartering events.

Professionally, Brother Searfoss was an accountant, and later a Professor of Business Technologies at Owens Technical and Community Colleges in his hometown of Perrysburg, Ohio.

Brother Searfoss is survived by his wife Lorene, three children, four grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, and his Brother, Dr. Kenneth Searfoss ('55).

"John loved being part of William and Mary and we loved being part of his family. Our hearts go out to John's beloved wife, Sue, his children and entire extended family."

Last May, Brother Gerdelman was awarded an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree and was recognized for

his and his wife's contributions to the school through service and philanthropic initiatives. Matthew Lambert, Vice President for University Advancement, said he'll leave the legacy of a "servant leader."

The Reverend Dr. Paul Currie ('47), Pastor Emeritus of the First Presbyterian Church of Caruthersville, Missouri died on May 2, 2020 at the age of 91, surrounded by the spirit of his family. Dr. Currie was born in Jackson, TN on Christmas Day in 1928. He graduated from Jackson High School in 1946 and from Southwestern at Memphis (now Rhodes College) in 1950 with a B.A. degree with Distinction in Economics. At Southwestern, he was captain of the tennis team, a member of ODK honorary leadership fraternity, Grand Master of Kappa Sigma Fraternity, President of the Senior Class, and was selected to the Hall of Fame.

During his college years, Dr. Currie served in the Marine Corps reserves and following graduation he served in the Army as a rifleman in the infantry with seven months of combat in Korea. On being discharged from the Army, he entered Louisville Presbyterian Seminary and graduated with a Master Divinity degree in 1956.

In February 1956, Dr. Currie accepted a call to be the minister of Trinity Presbyterian Church in Jonesville, Louisiana. He called June 16, 1956, the "best day of my life" for that is the date of his marriage to Dorothy McIntosh of Memphis, TN.

In March 1958, he became the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Caruthersville and served this church for 39 years until his retirement in April of 1997. At his

Don was a graduate of the University of Arkansas, where he became a Kappa Sigma, which he remained steadfastly until the day of his death. He was also appointed by the Governor to serve on the State Council for Higher Education and served on boards for companies and corporations, including Local Voice Media.

retirement, the Caruthersville City Council designated April 6, 1997 as "Dr. Paul Currie Sunday" in Caruthersville and named part of 7th Street "Dr. Paul Currie Avenue."

Dr. Currie received the Doctor of Ministry Degree from McCormick Seminary in Chicago in 1980 and was awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree from Rhodes College in 1982.

Dr. Currie was the President of the Caruthersville Ministerial Association seven times and served on the Caruthersville Park and Recreation Board, the Caruthersville Housing Authority Board, the Sheltered Workshop Board, and the Reynolds Park Board. He helped organize the first Alcoholic Anonymous group in Pemiscot County and assisted securing public housing for the city of Caruthersville. Dr. Currie had the honor of opening the United States Senate with prayer on September 22, 1983.

Dr. Currie was an avid fan and supporter of the Caruthersville High School athletics and rarely missed a Tiger football game in the past half century. He promoted tennis in Caruthersville by helping to secure tennis courts, giving free tennis lessons, holding tournaments, and supporting the high school teams.

Above all else, Dr. Currie was a devoted family man, a faithful friend, and a dedicated pastor.

His and Ellen's philanthropies included, in addition to myriad local causes, the University of Arkansas, Arkansas Children's Hospital, the Cancer Research Institute at UAMS, and many others.
